A205 Tulse Hill Gyratory Upcoming night-time resurfacing works

I am writing to let you know that we will be resurfacing a section of A205 Tulse Hill Gyratory between 05 December and 17 December 2022. Work will take place overnight between 20:00 and 06:00.

Local traffic diversions will be in place during the works.

How our works may affect you

The work will be carried out overnight to reduce the impact on traffic. During each phase of work, a length of the carriageway will be removed and resurfaced. Road closures will be in place; however, diversions will be clearly signposted. Details are set out below. To limit disturbance to residents we aim to complete the noisiest work before midnight each evening.

Dates and times	Traffic impacts
Mon 05 Dec – Thu 08 Dec 20:00-06:00	Tulse Hill Road: Abbess Close junction – Norwood Road junction There is an eastbound closure of Tulse Hill along the north side of the gyratory between Abbess Close and Norwood Road, and a closure on the southbound Norwood Road approach to the gyratory. Thurlow Park Road will also be closed eastbound up until the St. Faith's Road junction. Buses that travel southbound along Norwood Road will be able to travel through the gyratory between 20:00 – 21:00.
Thu 08 Dec – Sat 10 Dec 20:00-06:00	Tulse Hill Gyratory junction with Norwood Road north side – Norwood Road junction with Parade Mews Southbound directional closure along Norwood Road with diversions and lane closures on gyratory. Thurlow Park Road will also be closed westbound between Norwood Road and Avenue Park Road.

Mon 12 Dec – Thu 15 Dec 20:00-06:00	Tulse Hill Gyratory: Christchurch Road junction with Norwood Road – Christchurch Road outside no. 94 Westbound directional closure with diversions and lane closures on gyratory. Hardel Rise will also be fully closed on the west side of the gyratory.
Thu 15 Dec – Sat 17 Dec 20:00-06:00	Tulse Hill Gyratory junction with Christchurch Road – Tulse Hill Gyratory junction with Tulse Hill Road Northbound directional closure along Hardel Rise with diversions and lane closures on gyratory.

We have agreed the working hours with the local authority and we will make every effort to finish the works on time, although poor weather conditions may mean we need to reschedule at short notice.

Walking routes, cycling and Bus journeys

Please be aware that bus services may be affected by the work and bus stops may have to temporarily close during the work and be replaced by temporary stops. Please visit tfl.gov.uk/bus/status or follow [@TfLBusAlerts](https://twitter.com/TfLBusAlerts) on Twitter for live updates. Pavements and pedestrian crossings will remain open wherever possible. Signage will be in place to direct cyclists to alternative routes.
